The meeting was held at O'Charleys and started at 6:30 PM.

Presiding Officer: Marion English

The minutes from the September 6, 2005 and October 11, 2005 meetings were reviewed. The only change that needed to be made was the addition of Charles Woods name to the list of attendees at the September 6 meeting.

Motion: Moved that the minutes from September 6 and October 11 be approved as amended. (Moved by Laura Stanley, seconded by Deron Pardue) Passed unanimously

Treasurer's Report – Lee Butts

The transition from the UGA Foundation to the Arch Foundation is going smoothly. Lee is currently working with the Arch Foundation to get more detailed information on the accounts that the RBAA has with them. The accounts that are now with the Arch Foundation are the Redcoat Enrichment Fund, the Roger Dancz Scholarship Fund, the Phyllis Dancz Scholarship Fund, and the Steve Mahoney Memorial Fund. The funds that are left in the UGA Foundation accounts will eventually be transitioned to the Arch Foundation. Lee's recommendation is to leave the UGA Foundation accounts open for a year in case any contributions come in to the Foundation.

This year, there has been increased cooperation between the UGA Alumni Association and the Redcoat Alumni Association. With very little advanced notice, the UGA Alumni Association helped us out with Homecoming. They gave us a banner that we could hang at Homecoming and promotional items to help with fundraising. They also gave us email assistance. Lee made a motion to write a letter to the UGA Alumni Association thanking them for their help.

Motion: Moved that Lee Butts write a letter to the Alumni Association and (1) thank them for their participation at Homecoming 2005 and (2) ask them for financial assistance in preparing for Homecoming 2006 (list serve service, Reflector, promotional items). (Moved by Lee Butts, seconded by Jeffrey Delk) Passed unanimously

Homecoming 2005

Lee and Linda Butts put together handouts that recapped both the pre-planning stage and the actual Homecoming event. Copies of the handouts are attached to the minute. They also had a handout that summarized the responses to the Homecoming 2005 survey on the website. This handout is also attached to the minutes.

Homecoming 2005 was a success. The Board got a lot of good response from Redcoat Alumni. At tonight meeting, we discussed ways that we could make Homecoming 2006 even better.

(1) It was suggested that we organize the events (i.e. the after game event) by decade. That way it would be easier for alumni to find others who were in the band at the same time they were. Another suggestion was that we have a location on the website where alumni could look and see who else was coming to Homecoming from their decade.

(2) Rehearsal for the pre-game show went very well. The idea not to have a music rehearsal helped out with time. One suggestion for next year is to have rehearsal assistants from the Redcoat Band helping the alumni with the drill. Another suggestion for next year is to fill the vacancies in the formation at the beginning of rehearsal. There were some problems with people being moved to fill vacancies at the end of rehearsal after they had practiced at another position. This caused confusion for some people when it was time to do the pre-game show. These problems will be discussed further before Homecoming 2006.

(3) Performing for halftime was a problem this year because everyone had to come down from the 3rd level. Some people did not even bother with coming down for halftime. It was decided that we would not perform at halftime next year.

(4) Another suggestion was that we publish on the website what the order of music is going to be for pre-game so people can organize their music before they get there.

(5) The on-line registration was very successful this year. We need to make it easier for people to check their status. If we set it up so alumni can check by using their email address, then they won't have to remember their registration number.

(6) There seem to be a problem early on in registration with alumni ordering tickets for their neighbors. This was a problem because the tickets were supposed to be only for family members. This also presented problems down the road with checks not coming in because the alumni did not want to pay for their neighbor's tickets. Lee suggested that we solve this problem by saying that each Redcoat alumni could get only two tickets. If they have a larger family then they can request family tickets.

(7) There were also some communication gaps. There were alumni who did not receive the Reflector with details about Homecoming, and there were also alumni who did not get the postcard that was mailed telling them to go to the Redcoat Alumni Band website to register for Homecoming. There were unfortunately some alumni that did not get any information on Homecoming.

(8) We did break even on the after game event. A lot of people that did not go commented that going to an event after the game made for too long a day. There was discussion about having a Tailgating Party this year after rehearsal. It was agreed to discuss this matter further at the next meeting when we start planning for Homecoming 2006.

(9) It was also decided that we would contact the Athletic Association in January about tickets. We are going to ask for more tickets and also ask if we can get tickets in the lower level this year.

Other suggestions for Homecoming 2006 that were not discussed during the meeting are listed in the handouts from Lee and Linda.

The ornament sale was very successful. The first order was sold out. A check for \$2,500.00 was given to Dr. Romine to be used as needed by the Redcoat Band.

Development Committee Report

Linda Butts and Jeffrey Delk are going to start going through class rolls at the Registrar Office to find the names of people that were in the Redcoat Band. They will focus initially on the time period from 1996-2001. This time was chosen because a lot Redcoats from that time were lost. They will also be trying to find those people who were in the Redcoat Band but then dropped out of school. These people are hard to track down because they are not in the UGA Alumni Association database.

Practice Field

The practice field proposal that was sent to Arnett Mace presented four locations as possible sites for the practice field. Apparently none of these four sites can be used for a practice field. The University is looking for another location that could be used for the practice field.

Nominating Committee

Marion English will be stepping down as President of the Board of Directors after Homecoming 2006. Laura Stanley is the President-elect, but it is possible that she will be in graduate school and will not be able to serve as President. Therefore, the Board needs to nominate candidates for President and President-elect. The By-Laws state that the nomination of candidates for office should be done by a Nominating Committee. Marion will chair the committee. Deron Pardue agreed to serve on the committee and Marion will ask Amber Weldon-Stephens to serve on the committee. The Committee will nominate candidates for President and President-elect and the members of the RBAA will vote for or against these candidates during Homecoming 2006. These are the only two offices that need to be voted on this year.

New Business

The Board discussed whether the Redcoat Alumni Band should continue to perform at halftime with the Redcoat Band during Homecoming. One of the main problems this year was getting down to the field for halftime from the 3rd level. If we knew we could get lower level seats, this would not be as much of a problem. Another problem is the possibility that Laura Stanley may go to graduate school and not be available to help with Homecoming this year. For the last two years, Laura was responsible for borrowing the extra instruments we needed from area high schools. She determined what instruments were needed, called the high school band directors about borrowing their instruments, and coordinated the pick-up of the instruments Friday night before Homecoming and the return of the instruments after Homecoming. It would be very difficult to find someone else to do this job.

Motion: Moved that the Redcoat Alumni Band not perform at halftime during Homecoming every year. (Moved by Marion English, seconded by Rebecca Willoughby) Passed unanimously

Motion: To amend the previous motion to say that we will march during halftime with the Redcoat Band every five years (00 and 05). (Moved by Lee Butts, seconded by Marion English) Passed unanimously

Next Meeting Date

The next meeting will be Tuesday, February 7, 2006 at the new O'Charleys location on Lawrenceville-Suwanee Road in Lawrenceville.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 PM.

Redcoat Reflector via Email - As a new web site feature, any Redcoat Alumni can opt to receive the Redcoat Reflector via email (saving paper and postage). To date, **239 people** have opted to receive information in this manner.

Request to Make Contact Info Changes Over the Web – The suggestion to allow Alumni to make "contact changes" to their record was implemented in November. A former Redcoat can enter their email address, receive a temporary password, login to their information and make appropriate changes. A before-and-after snapshot of their activity is kept, to avoid fraud. **Synchronization with the Foundation** - We have requested to receive the same information from the Arch Foundation in an automated manner. When we receive the Arch's format for changes, we can implement a process to swap information.

Welcome the 2005 Graduates – At the Annual Banquet, the Redcoat graduates were welcomed into the Redcoat Alumni Band. For the first time, their names and emails were captured for the Alumni database. In order to help make them feel welcome, a certificate was presented with the following information (see last page):

- **Suggestion:** Clear policy on refunds – No refunds for “Family” ticket less than 1 month notice.
- Have a ticket swap table (or online page) for those needing to sell and buy “Family” tickets.
- There was abuse in ordering “Family” tickets. Some speculation attempted to bring neighbors (not family). This contributed to delayed checks and sabotaged wait list procedure. **Suggestion:** Limit of 2 “Family” tickets per alumni. Allow a policy of exceptions when family is larger than 3 members (and only one Redcoat Alumni).
- Delayed checks caused un-needed calling and uncertainty in numbers. Can be avoided with clear policies when “check not received”.
- Waiting List – did not work well.
- Make “Status” a bounce-back email instead of online screen accessed by Registration number and last name.
- **Suggestion:** Meeting with Athletic Department to know ticket timing and location to develop message to Alumni.
- Consider lunch event (comments on long day)
- Make name and address maintenance a user responsibility - done
- Pulldown menu of instruments for consistency (no need to type)
